This could be a blessing for the leader of the Liberal-Democratic Party of Japan, as it means he can pretty much stay wherever he wants, without being rumbled. Since he is also known to have a strict daily fitness regime which includes 40 minutes of walking each morning and 100 sit-ups each night, he would enjoy the beautiful, four-bedroom Alba Beach House, right on Porthmeor Beach in St Ives. They are also partial to yachting and jet skiing and have a holiday home in the seaside town of Le Touquet ('Paris on Sea'), just south of Calais, whose beaches the late photographer Peter Lindbergh once described as 'better than the Bahamas'.
