

A guide to Bodmin: the lesser-visited Cornish hotspot you need on your radar

Where to eat, play and stay in the Cornish town of Bodmin

Little Inka Cottage

Sitting in the little village of St Breward, this hideaway is a romantic bolthole where its key feature is the expansive window directly above the bed installed for stargazing, as the Moor has dark sky status due to its incredibly low light pollution. Made up of two adjoining cabins with a small courtyard, one features moody black walls in the lounge and kitchen, where pops of colour from copper features, tan-leather furniture and hanging plants liven it.

There's also a free-standing copper roll-top bath, plus a hot tub to soak in after a day of rambling and a fire pit outside. The best bit? Nearby are alpacas which you can help feed or walk. A welcome hamper with local produce is included, while linen bathrobes and scented candles are also provided.
