A former student at the Royal College of Art, he captured its moods and movement in bronzes of jackdaws, bulls, goats and — of course — pigs, and you'll be able to enjoy them at your leisure at Pomona, his three-bedroom former home. You'll enjoy Cornwall's Coverack coast too. The house and its surrounding sculptures sit just above the cliffs on a crescent-shape bay, so you can mix stirring walks with feet-up moments back at your rather luxurious base.
