From remote treehouses to modernist huts, clifftop cabins to mountain retreats

1. Aurora, Whitsand Bay, Cornwall

High on the rockface above Freathy Beach is a clapboard cabin with blockbuster views of the bay's salty squalls and supernatural sunrises. It's totally immersed in its surroundings – it would be almost impossible not to relax here, even when the weather is intense. A great place to go when you want to be reminded of the raw power of Mother Nature. From £1,250 for three nights;

5. The Cable Hut, Pembrokeshire, Wales

It was built to house telephone cables but this century-old dwelling couldn't feel more blissfully disconnected. Set at the top of a coastal track, the retreat for two is half traditional stone cottage, half corrugated-iron hut, with a raised dual-aspect summerhouse at the rear of the site. There are breathtaking coastal vantage points of the tempestuous sea and sunsets as well as a secluded hot tub and outdoor firepit. From £950 for three nights; uniquehomestays.com
