Fans of The Holiday will love Little Red Lock, an idyllic converted barn in the Cotswolds, set on a winding canal that looks as if it's straight out of the film. The house, a part of the Unique Homestays portfolio, oozes luxurious, eccentric Oxfordshire charm, with its exposed brick walls, copper pots and Aga stove. It's a true getaway, so deep in the countryside that you can only access it by foot or water (the closest parking is a clearing in the woods about 10 minutes away, or you can arrange for the house manager to collect you by boat.) That means the home is encircled by tranquil views: a living room opens onto the canal and the bedrooms overlook sprawling, rolling fields.
